

## CLEAN SWEEP GUIDELINES

**Agricultural pre-registration is mandatory for quantities over 200 lbs.**

Each **household** may bring up to, and no more than, a combination of five gallons of liquid or 50 pounds of solid waste.

Materials should be properly identified in their original containers with original labels.

Unknown materials can be brought in, but may be refused if the waste hauler cannot dispose of it, or if disposal costs are excessive.

If your volume of unknown materials exceeds five gallons or 50 pounds, contact the UW-Extension Office in advance to make **required** special arrangements.

Do not mix substances together! Doing so can be extremely dangerous!

Pack materials safely. Place waste in a cardboard box lined with a plastic bag and separate each product with folded newspaper.

## Mercury Exchange

**Mercury is hazardous! Exchange your mercury thermometer for a mercury-free digital thermometer. Mercury thermometers have a silver liquid – not a red liquid. Bring to Clean Sweep in a Ziploc bag...limit of one thermometer per household, while supplies last.**

Hazardous chemicals can cause health, safety, or environmental problems. Improperly stored or disposed chemicals can pollute ground and surface waters. Participants will not be held liable for the proper disposal of materials collected.

All Wood County residents can participate.

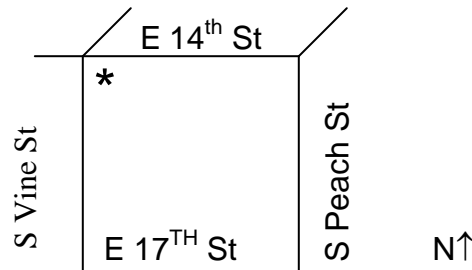
## IS THERE A COST TO PARTICIPATE?

Households and farms are allowed to dispose of hazardous waste **without charge**; however, **quantities may be restricted**.

Drain Cleaner	Oven Cleaner
Silver Polish	Floor Polish
Mildew Cleaner	Dry Cleaning Fluid
Metal Cleaners	NiCad Batteries
	Photography Chemicals

### WORKSHOP

Stripper	Wood Preservatives
Hobby Materials	Thinner/Solvents
Gun Cleaning Fluid	Turpentine
Lead-Based Paints	Varnish
Lacquer	Creosote

**LATEX PAINT, MOTOR OIL, EXPLOSIVES AND HIGH PRESSURE CYLINDERS CANNOT BE ACCEPTED.**
