First Tuesday in April

### Fall Primary

Second Tuesday in August of even-numbered years

### General Election

First Tuesday after the first Monday in November in even-numbered years

# Voting in the Village of Biron



Our goal is for all eligible voters to be able to cast a ballot and have that ballot counted

## **Voter Eligibility**

To be eligible to vote you must be:  
United States citizen  
Age 18 or older by Election Day  
Resident of Biron for at least 10 consecutive days before the election  
Finished serving sentence, including probation/parole, if convicted of felony

## **Voter Registration**

Up to 20 days before an election you may register to vote in the Village Clerk's Office with proof of address through the Friday before an election

On Election Day you can register to vote at your polling place with proof of address.

## **Proof of Address**

When registering, you need to present one of the following documents . either in paper of electronic format . showing your current name at your address:

- WI driver license or WI state ID card
- Utility bill from last 90 days (water, gas, electric, cable, internet, landline or cellular phone)
- Bank or credit union statement
- Property tax bill or receipt
- Government document or check
- Paycheck
- Residential Lease (a lease cannot be used when registering by mail)
- Affidavit on letterhead from a public or private social service agency that is providing series to a homeless voter
- College fee statement from last 9 months, with student ID

## **Voting Absentee**

Absentee ballots are kept sealed and secure in the Clerk's Office vault until counted at the polls on Election Day.

You may vote absentee in the Clerk's Office between 7:30 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. weekdays beginning the 15<sup>th</sup> day before an election and ending the Friday before an election

## **Voting Absentee by Mail**

To receive an absentee ballot by mail, submit a written request containing:

- Your name
- Address where registered to vote
- Address where ballot should be sent
- Your signature

Send the Clerk a copy or picture of your ID along with your absentee request.

It is a felony to vote at the polls if you have returned an absentee ballot to the Clerk's Office.

In order for your absentee ballot to be counted, you must:

- Sign the certificate envelope
- Have a witness sign the envelope

## **Election Day**

Polls open at 7:00 a.m. and close at 8:00 p.m. Everyone in line at 8:00 p.m. gets to vote.

If you move within 10 days of an election you can only vote from your previous address, at your old polling place.

Voters with mobility issues or difficulty waiting in line may vote from the curb of their polling place.

Voters must sign or make their mark on the poll book. Voters unable to sign due to a disability are exempt from this requirement.

To vote, fill in the oval next to the name of your candidate. Insert your ballot in the tabulator and wait for a thank you message. Do not leave if you see an error message. Ask to see a Chief Election Inspector.

## **Voter ID**

Wisconsin requires voters to show ID. The following types of ID are acceptable:

- WI driver license or WI DOT-issued photo ID card expiring 11/4/14 or later
- US Passport expiring 11/4/14 or later
- Military ID card expiring 11/4/14 or later

- Certificate of naturalization issued within the last 2 years

- Unexpired WI driver license or DOT-issued photo ID receipt

- Unexpired ID card issued by a federally recognized Indian tribe in WI

- WI accredited university/college ID with issuance date, signature, and expiration within 2 years of issuance, and proof of current enrollment

- A Veteran Affairs ID card (must be unexpired or have no expiration date)
